

Grooming

- 2.1 Victorians are to be mindful of their personal grooming as it projects the school image and the Victorian community they belong to. Thus, Victorians are to ensure that their <u>hair is kept short and neatly combed</u> without reaching the eyebrows in front, the collar at the back and the ears at the sides, nor be outlandishly styled, dyed or coloured. Sideburns should not be lower than at the half-ear mark.
- 2.2 Victorians must be clean-shaven and neat in appearance.
- 2.3 Victorians are to keep their fingernails clean and short.
- 2.4 Victorians are not allowed to wear ear-rings, nose-rings/studs, body piercings, white transparent/translucent ear sticks on the earlobes, chains, necklaces, rings, chokers, bangles, wrist bands, either of cloth, string, leather, plastic or metal, or any objects deemed inappropriate by the school.
- 2.5 Victorians are not allowed to have any form of body decoration (eg. Tattoos). The school reserves the right to suspend Victorians found with any form of body decoration indefinitely.

- 8.1 Victorians are to zealously guard and protect the good image of the school by carrying themselves with respect, pride and dignity at all times in and out of school.
- 8.2 Victorians are to be loyal and present their best behaviour, expected of law-abiding citizens. Good school climate and moral tone is achieved through the concerted effort of all Victorians in the school. Discipline is therefore, the responsibility and duty of every Victorian.
- 8.3 Victorians are to prepare well to excel in any competition or activity and be sporting and gracious in accepting the decision or outcome.

Transiting to Secondary 1

SUPPORT

- Find out how your child's preferences are changing.
 Show interest by asking open-ended questions.
- Make a habit of chatting at a fixed time each day.



AFFIRM

- Remember your child's strengths. Build his selfesteem in those areas.
- Praise and affirm efforts in front of relatives and friends.



FAMILIARISE

- Find out what secondary school life is like for students these days.
- Excite him about new experiences secondary school students can have.
- Encourage him to pick up a new hobby or hone skills in outdoor sports.
- Limit his time spent on digital devices.



EMPATHISE

- Acknowledge your child's varying emotions.
- Encourage your child to share thoughts and feelings about the new school.
- Prioritise sufficient sleep.
