Our Victorian Heritage

1876

Kampong Glam

Victoria School had its origin in an English Class established in 1876 in Kampong Glam Malay School. The first headmaster was Mr. M. Hellier, the man who organized and taught the English classes there. The school enrolment grew but there were teething problems.

The school provided poor shelter from the weather. On hot and windy days, clouds of dust blew into the classrooms with adverse effects on the boys and teachers.

The school was often flooded. Our pioneers did not always find attending school a pleasant pursuit. Nevertheless, the students pressed on with their studies.

1900

Syed Alwi

The school moved to its new premises at Syed Alwi, near Victoria Bridge. It was known as Victoria Bridge School.

The first annual sports meet took place in 1915. In 1929, the 'House System' was introduced and the House prefects were appointed in 1930.

Until 1930, Victoria had only primary classes - Primary 1 to Standard 5. From 1931, the school became a secondary school.

1933

Tyrwhitt

The school moved to Tyrwhitt Road and it came to be known as Victoria School in 1933.

In 1940, the prefect badge was introduced. The School Motto 'Nil Sine Labore' also came into existence. During the Japanese Occupation, the school was renamed Jalan Besar Boys' School.

In 1951, the Post School Certificate classes were started. A few girls joined the classes. Our school song was composed and set to music in the early fifties.

The school made great strides, in the field of academic as well as in ECA. In 1979, Victoria School became a Pre-University Center, offering 3-year Pre-University courses.

1984

Geylang Bahru

A new chapter began when Victoria Junior College opened its doors at Marine Parade in 1984, and Victoria School moved to its Geylang Bahru site that same year.

The Art Elective Programme was introduced in 1985 in Victoria School. Victoria Challenge, an event now fondly remembered by all Victorians, started in July 1987.

In 1993, Victoria School was accorded autonomous school status. The school hosted the Gifted Education Programme from 2001 to 2005.

2003

Siglap Link

In May 2003, the school moved to its current premises at Siglap Link.

In 2008, it started the Regional Studies Programme offering Bahasa Indonesia as a third language.

In 2012, Victoria School implemented the Victoria-Cedar Alliance Integrated Programme (VCA IP), together with Cedar Girls' Secondary School and Victoria Junior College.

Today, the VCA partnership has broadened to include key areas such as CCA, talent development and student leadership.

With its humble beginnings as a Malay school with twelve boys in 1876, Victoria School was soon established as the second government secondary school in Singapore. From its establishment till today, the school places serving the educational needs of the community first, in an ever changing social, political and economic landscape.

Today, boys from a range of family backgrounds, ethnicities and nationalities walk through our gates to join our Victorian family. Every boy adds diversity to our campus and allows for the natural growth of mutual respect and appreciation for differences, as life-long friendships are forged.

It is hard to miss our Victorians when they are in their attire for sports and games. In Victoria School, our boys wear their distinctive bumblebee PE attire, that consists of a vibrant yellow tee-shirt with a black trim, paired with black shorts.

VICTORIA ADVISORY COMMITTEE (VAC)

Our VAC, which has served in an advisory and voluntary capacity since 1968, plays an active part in ensuring that every Victorian is given the opportunity to participate in the wide variety of programmes and activities available in VS.

The VAC underscores the importance of performance excellence by sponsoring awards which recognise character and hard work for outstanding Victorians. In the process, it aims to develop scholastic talents and healthy pursuits in school as well as a strong sense of belonging to the nation.

PARENT SUPPORT GROUP (PSG)

Victoria School is a second home for our students. The establishment of the Victoria School PSG in 1999 was a natural extension of this sentiment. The PSG is now an integral part of the Victorian family, and like all families, everyone pitches in when they can and gives their best to ensure a warm and caring home, helping every son of Victoria to become the best that he can be.

In addition to professional sharing through career talks and providing work attachment opportunities for Victorians, our PSG strengthens the Victorian family by organising workshops and bonding activities that enhance parent-child relationships.

Today the partnership extends to CCA student leadership development and talent development so as to ensure that our students benefit from the alliance.

VICTORIA-CEDAR ALLIANCE - SINGAPORE UNIVERSITY OF TECHNOLOGY AND DESIGN (VCA-SUTD)

Launched in 2012, the VCA-SUTD Social Innovation Partnership aims to develop in our Victorians divergent thinking skills, enabling them to handle ambiguity and explore diverse perspectives in their pursuit of sustainable solutions for our community.

The VCA and SUTD faculties work together to conceptualise the Imagineering Programme, which equips Victorians with the processes and tools for Design Thinking.

Since 2013, all Year 3 students in the VCA IP apply Design Thinking in conceptualising and implementing Social Innovation projects that aim to improve the community.

The Victoria School experience changes a person. Victorians emerge with an excitement for life, a passion for learning and an indomitable spirit. Always spirited, the young men carry with them that 'something more' out into the world, to confidently conquer the paths they choose and leave their distinctive mark, making the world a more lively and dynamic place. They have a gift for living life to the fullest.

Being in Victoria School allows our students the freedom to be who they are, and the encouragement to carve out a niche for themselves and to succeed in their endeavours.

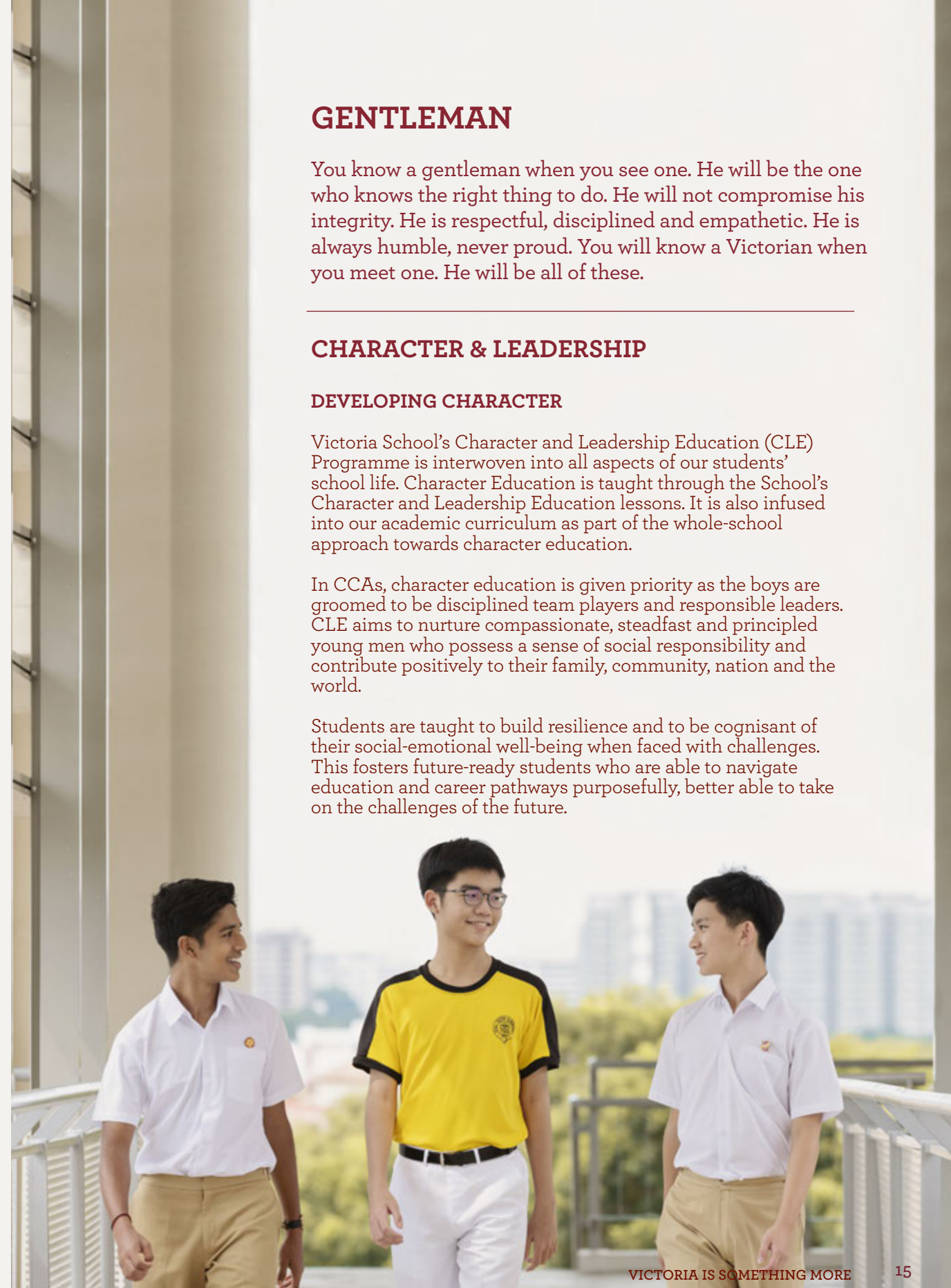
CHARACTER & LEADERSHIP

DEVELOPING CHARACTER

Victoria School's Character and Leadership Education (CLE) Programme is interwoven into all aspects of our students' school life. Character Education is taught through the School's Character and Leadership Education lessons. It is also infused into our academic curriculum as part of the whole-school approach towards character education.

In CCAs, character education is given priority as the boys are groomed to be disciplined team players and responsible leaders. CLE aims to nurture compassionate, steadfast and principled young men who possess a sense of social responsibility and contribute positively to their family, community, nation and the world.

Students are taught to build resilience and to be cognisant of their social-emotional well-being when faced with challenges. This fosters future-ready students who are able to navigate education and career pathways purposefully, better able to take on the challenges of the future.



Student Leadership Education is instituted as part of Character and Leadership Education in Victoria School, in the quest of grooming upright and balanced individuals with leadership qualities. Student Leadership Education aims to instill in Victorians a spirit of achievement, to nurture them into becoming innovative and respected leaders.

Our Student Leadership Programmes enable the boys to be directly involved in planning, teamwork and effective execution of various tasks. SOCIAL INNOVATION

Victoria School has adopted Design Thinking as the methodology for Social Innovation Projects. Design Thinking, which uses the 5 stages of Empathise, Define, Ideate, Prototype and Test, draws upon logic, imagination, intuition, and systematic reasoning to explore possibilities of what could be, and to create desired outcomes that benefit the target audience.

All Victorians take part in projects which involve both analysis and imagination. Actively contributing to and participating in these projects will not only help them make a difference to the community, it will also make a difference to their personal growth and development.

Nurturing Leaders

VICTORIA CHALLENGE

Victoria Challenge, a quadrennial event initiated in July 1987, is one of our many cherished traditions.

The challenge lies in the time constraint imposed as Victorians pledge to complete their chosen tasks within 24 hours. In addition to class-based challenges, the whole school comes together to complete a school-wide challenge.

Even our alumni return to complete challenges of their own. The Victoria Challenge is also a time when our students reveal their distinctive personalities, talents and interests, as they plan and carry out projects which are from the heart and in their own inimitable Victorian voice.



BEYOND BORDERS

This programme offers Victorians an experience that takes them on a discovery of the world outside their classroom and allows them to see things with new perspectives. We believe that for our students to have a deeper global awareness and understanding of other cultures, it is important that they have experiences beyond their personal borders. Through this process of discovery, our students develop a sense of belonging to something that is much bigger than themselves and find their own place in the world.

This experiential learning takes place locally and globally. Our younger students are taken through a local experience, exploring facets of Singapore which are often overlooked. Our older students embark on trips overseas to hone their understanding of other cultures, widen their horizons and gain more confidence in their cross-cultural interaction with others.

BOARDING PROGRAMME

Within our school grounds at Siglap Link is our hostel, Victoria Hall. The hostel provides accommodation for our international and local students. In addition, the hostel offers Victorians the unique experience of boarding in the Victorian Leadership Boarding Programme, which has been running since 2014.

Every term, a selection of classes board at the Hostel to develop a keener sense of self-discipline and independence, under the guidance of our residential Teacher Mentors. During their term of stay, there are activities that build camaraderie and broaden the students' experiences beyond their academic studies in Victoria School.

VICTORIAN AESTHETICS EDUCATION PROGRAMME (VAEP)

The VAEP develops our Victorians into gentlemen with a finer appreciation of the arts. The school provides many platforms for the aesthetic development and expression of the Victorian. Within the academic curriculum, students enjoy the Aesthetics Modules.

In Lower Secondary, they do Art & Design, Culinary Arts, Design & Technology and Music. Victorians hone their aesthetic senses through these experiences.

Lunch-time concerts provide a stage for music-making and creative expression. The VS Arts Festival, consisting of concerts put up by our Performing Arts CCAs, continue to develop in students a deep involvement and appreciation for culture and the arts.

In addition to these platforms which reach out to all Victorians, we also provide programmes for those with passion, talent and leadership potential in the aesthetics.

These are the Art Elective Programme (AEP), the Performing Arts CCAs (Chinese Orchestra, Choir, Concert Band and English Drama) and the Media Arts CCAs (Audio Visual Club and Photography Club).

Students are further equipped with management and leadership skills as they collaborate and lead in the organisation of aesthetics events such as school-based and public workshops, exhibitions and performances.

Sports is very much a part of every Victorian's life, as a participant or supporter of a game. Other than the twice-weekly Physical Education (PE) lessons that is part of our curriculum, our students look forward to school-wide sporting events, including the Annual Cross Country Championships, Annual Track and Field Championships, and Inter-House and Inter-Class games.

Being in a school with a strong sporting culture, Victorians are known to fill their breaks with a quick game of football, floorball or basketball. Others enjoy working out at the various fitness stations and play areas within the school after classes.

Our sportsmen bring honour to the school, achieving exceptional results in their various fields. It is through these diverse sports and activities that our Victorians develop a strong physique, and grow in sportsmanship, adaptability, confidence, discipline, perseverance, resilience and teamwork.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES (CCA)

At Victoria School, we offer a wide range of CCAs to cater to the needs, interests and talents of our Victorians. Through the CCAs, Victorians learn teamwork, develop confidence and hone their natural abilities. In Sports and Games, talented students can vie for a spot in thirteen teams: Badminton, Cricket, Cross Country, Floorball, Football, Hockey, Sailing, Shooting, Table Tennis, Tennis, Track & Field, Volleyball and Wushu.

For our students with a more artistic bent, we offer an array of Visual and Performing Arts groups: Chinese Orchestra, Choir, Concert Band, English Drama and Photography Club. Students with eclectic tastes, technical interests and who show an inclination towards books and language can choose to join one of the Clubs & Societies: Audi-Visual Club, Chess Club, Debating & Oratorical Society and Infocomm Club.

Finally, our list of Uniformed Groups which develop our students in character, discipline and physical ruggedness, includes Boys' Brigade, National Cadet Corps (Land), National Cadet Corps (Sea), National Police Cadet Corps, Red Cross and Scouts.



VICTORIAN SPORTS EXCELLENCE PROGRAMME (VSEP)

Victorian sportsmen who are passionate about sports have the opportunity to choose the VSEP. The programme helps them to realise their aspirations for a future in sports talent management, sports science and physiological studies.

In this specialised field of study, our sportsmen in the O-Level Programme offer Exercise and Sports Science (ESS) at the GCE O-Level Examination at the end of their fourth year. In addition, they participate in sports leadership courses, workshops, seminars, masterclasses and work attachment. Under an authentic sports education curriculum, our students acquire the knowledge and skills to enhance their individual and team performance, and explore their interests in the sports industry.

HOUSES

Each Victorian belongs to one of the five houses - Glam, Kallang, Kapar, Rochor and Whampoa. Our House system allows our students to interact across cohorts. Friendly and healthy rivalry among the Houses is highly charged during the school's annual sports fixtures, such as the Annual Cross Country Championships, Annual Track and Field Championships and during Inter-House Games.

LEADER

At Victoria School, our students are encouraged to pursue excellence and to follow through with what they embark on with commitment, dedication and enthusiasm.

The Victorian has grit and will do his utmost to keep up with the best. It is this attitude of challenging himself and always thinking of how he will ride the next crest that will identify the leader in every Victorian - one who inspires through resilience, strives for excellence, and uplifts others along the way.

We encourage our Victorians to develop strong academic ambition, chart their own learning pathway, and establish clear goals and targets. The academic programmes cater to our young talents, stimulate students' intellectual curiosity and set new challenges to stretch their abilities.

These programmes – which emphasise independent thought, critical thinking, intellectual discourse and research – enhance our students' overall Victorian experience, equipping our students to be prepared for the world beyond the school.

EDUCATION AND CAREER GUIDANCE (ECG)

Education and Career Guidance (ECG) equips our students with the necessary knowledge, skills and values to make decisions at each key education stage for a successful transition from school to further education and work.

In Victoria School, Victorians acquire the dispositions to be lifelong learners, ready for the world of work and for life. They develop a growth mindset in order to pursue their aspirations and build a resilient attitude, so as to embrace future challenges and opportunities.

TALENT DEVELOPMENT

At Victoria School, performance excellence is one of our core values. It reflects the desire of every Victorian to do his best, excel and thrive. Talent Development is in line with the school's vision and mission to groom the talents of every Victorian and to develop our young men into professionals who contribute to their family, work, community and nation.

The Talent Development Programme at Victoria School creates learning opportunities beyond a student's academic pursuits and caters to individual student needs, helping him stretch his potential to the fullest.

We provide platforms for students with exceptional abilities to develop their talents in both the cognitive and personal domains. Students with leadership potential are provided with opportunities for leadership development and mentoring in CCA and leadership boards.

In addition, the affective needs of high-ability students are supported through education and career guidance, thus enabling them to develop a sense of empathy and commitment to contribute their talents as respected members of society.

ART ELECTIVE PROGRAMME (AEP)

Established in Victoria School in 1985, the MOE-based Art Elective Programme (AEP) aims to provide academically able and artistically talented students with an in-depth knowledge and understanding of art practice, as well as a comprehensive study of historical and contemporary art.

The art-making process is designed to stimulate and develop students' creativity and problem solving skills. In the programme, the study of art extends beyond the acquisition of artistic skills and techniques. It is a journey that challenges the way students think, frees their imagination and encourages reflection about who they are and the world in which they live.

INNOVATION PROGRAMME

The MOE-organised Innovation Programme (IvP) allows students to develop their problem-solving and inventive skills by coming up with innovative ideas and products.

In Victoria School, students interested to participate in the IvP will be mentored by teachers and university lecturers as they adopt the Design Thinking Framework in the identification of an authentic problem and also in the formulation of a novel user-centred solution.

The programme culminates in the Young Innovators' Fair, where selected participants showcase their projects.

MALAY (SPECIAL PROGRAMME)

Victorians with a propensity for languages are encouraged to take up Malay language under the MOE-based Malay (Special Programme), or MSP. This third language programme has been offered to our students since 2013 and enables them to develop competence and confidence in the use of the Malay language. Through this programme, they learn to appreciate Malay traditions and culture, while making connections to their own.

For O-Level Programme students who offer MSP at the national examinations and receive a pass grade, they will be able to use the grade in lieu of a Humanities subject for admission to junior college. In addition, they are given a bonus of two points in their application to a junior college of their choice.

VICTORIA ENRICHMENT COURSE AND TEAM OF RESEARCHERS FOR SCIENCE (VECTORS)

The programme, VECTORS, is a source of great intellectual stimulation for Victorians with strong ambitions in the field of Science. It challenges and stretches students who demonstrate ability and interest in Science.

Our Victorians are given access to a wide range of opportunities to learn beyond the curriculum. These learning opportunities which take them out of their classrooms include enrichment modules (at junior colleges, polytechnics and universities), research mentorships, and participation in subject-based competitions.

HUMANITIES TALENT DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

The Humanities Talent Development Programme enhances the intellectual experience and achievements of our students in the Humanities, Arts and Social Sciences. In partnership with the public and private sectors, we provide local and global opportunities for Victorians to meaningfully engage with, and enrich the community.

Selected students participate in local and overseas Model United Nations conferences and joint research programmes with universities and civic societies, such as the Singapore Heritage Society. Through these opportunities, students hone their knowledge and skills.

ENGLISH TALENT DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

Victorians who excel in English are identified early by their teachers and mentored to develop their talents in writing and speaking. Talented students are selected to participate in various writing and oratorical programmes and contests, such as the Queen's Commonwealth Essay Competition, Creative Arts Programme and National Public Speaking Competition.

As part of their development, the students take on the role of emcees in school events.

MATHEMATICS TALENT DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME

Victorians who excel in Mathematics are encouraged to participate in mathematical research work, where they are part of a mentorship programme and are given the opportunity to explore advanced mathematical concepts.

Under this programme, our young mathematicians not only deepen their fascination for the subject, they also represent the school at the Singapore Mathematics Project Festival, the pinnacle competition for Singapore students.

Students who are keen to apply mathematical modeling skills to solve real world problems can participate in the International Mathematical Modeling Challenge.

This competition is based on the firm belief that students and teachers need to experience the power of mathematics to help better understand, analyze and solve real world problems outside of mathematics itself - and to do so in realistic contexts.

Talented students participate in the Singapore Mathematical Olympiad (SMO), which develops their thinking skills and prepares them for more advanced study of Mathematics.

REGIONAL STUDIES PROGRAMME (RSP)

The MOE-based Regional Studies Programme (RSP) is a language and enrichment programme that was introduced in Victoria School in 2008. Victorians taking RSP offer Bahasa Indonesia as a third language, and they undertake a specially designed module "Understanding Southeast Asia".

Through the study of people, places and cultures of Southeast Asia, complemented with local and overseas field trips, the programme equips students with the experience and relevant knowledge to become future leaders who can interact and operate in the region. Scholarships of S\$1000 per annum are awarded each year to outstanding students.

DIGITAL LITERACY

As part of the National Digital Literacy Programme (NDLP), every Victorian is equipped with a Personal Learning Device (PLD).

Through this programme, students are nurtured into self-directed and independent learners who take ownership of their learning. They also become effective communicators and collaborators, who learn to advocate and practice safe and responsible use of technology.

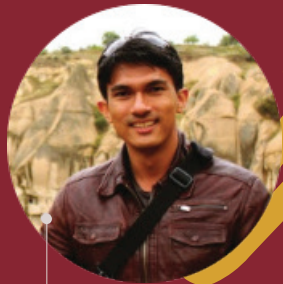

GET REAL! (INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME)

As part of the Victoria-Cedar Alliance Integrated Programme (VCA IP), all Year 4 students are required to participate in an internship/attachment/research experience before they commence their JC education at Victoria Junior College.

Through this experience, our students will develop a greater understanding of the society and world around them. This forms a deep appreciation of and concern for social issues within them. Students also develop skills to be effective team players who know how to combine their strengths with the capabilities of others to solve real societal problems.

During the internship period, students can be deployed to help in projects/ assignments at different companies and organisations that they are taught to write in to and gain their own internship positions. Companies and organisations assign mentors to help develop and feedback about the students' performance.

SOCIAL STUDIES EDUCATION

Social Studies Education in the VCA IP aims to develop students into informed, concerned and participative citizens, competent in decision-making with an impassioned spirit to contribute responsibly to the society and world they live in. This is done through examining authentic issues that are of concern to our society and the world we live in.

Students attain knowledge and understanding about these issues, develop critical and reflective thinking skills, and appreciate multiple perspectives. In addition, we seek to develop in our students a deeper understanding of the values that define the Singapore society, nurture dispositions that will inspire them to show concern for the society and the world they live in, and demonstrate empathy in their relationships with others.

RESEARCH EDUCATION

In the VCA, we tap on the students' passion for learning by providing them with platforms and opportunities to expand their understanding and thought processes through a rigorous Research Education curriculum. VJC offers a myriad of programmes that allow students to pursue their interests in the A-Level curriculum. Whether you are in the Science or Arts stream, there is something for everyone.

THE HUMANITIES PROGRAMME

VJC has been offering the Humanities Programme for more than twenty years. Beyond their academic studies, Humanities scholars are always attuned to discoveries, popular culture and current social issues.

They discover rich cultural traditions through local community exploration and a trip abroad in their first year. Scholars of the programme go on to graduate with a keener sense of the world, through their subjects and their penchant for a deeper level of thought.

As leaders of the pack, numerous Victorians have been awarded scholarships that are both valued and established, including bond-free scholarships such as the prestigious Loke Cheng Kim Scholarship and the Jardine Scholarship. VJC also has a proud history of students who have been awarded scholarships that have opened the door to enriching and boundless careers for Victorians. These include scholarships from the Public Service Commission, the Ministry of Health, the Ministry of Education, the Singapore Armed Forces, A*STAR, the National University of Singapore, Nanyang Technological University, Singapore Management University and Singapore University of Technology and Design.

If you are keen on applying for undergraduate scholarships to study at local or overseas universities, and you have a strong academic record and suitable personal qualities, you can apply to join Project EdVantage, our in-house scholarship programme. A teacher mentor will be assigned to provide you with close support and guidance as you go through your JC2 year. You will also be exposed to resume writing skills, and go through mock interviews to prepare you for the real thing.

Admissions

At Victoria School, we nurture outstanding students into Gentlemen, Professionals and Sportsmen who make tangible contributions to their family, work, community and nation. As a dual-track school, students can choose between our 4-year O-Level Programme or the 6-year Victoria-Cedar Alliance Integrated Programme (VCA IP) jointly offered with Cedar Girls' Secondary School (CGSS) and our affiliated college, Victoria Junior College (VJC). Students in the VCA IP will spend four years in VS and two years in VJC leading to the GCE A-Level Examinations.

Our students come from over 80 primary schools in Singapore. Students seeking admission into VS can apply through the following avenues

- Direct School Admission for Secondary 1
- Ministry of Education Secondary 1 Posting Exercise
- Admission to Year 3 Integrated Programme

DIRECT SCHOOL ADMISSION FOR SECONDARY 1

In line with the school's focus on holistic development and to nurture diversity of talents, VS admits students who demonstrate talent and ability in Leadership, Sports, Aesthetics, Languages and Science, Technology, Engineering & Mathematics (STEM).

To be eligible, the applicant must demonstrate their ability in the talent area and academic ability so as to ensure that they benefit from the rigorous total curriculum offered at VS. Generally, students should have:

- High intellectual potential and ability,
- High levels of motivation and commitment to excellence in academic and co-curricular areas (including but not limited to co-curricular activities and community involvement),
- Leadership potential with the commitment to serve others,
- A passion for life and learning, and
- Potential to contribute to the VS community.

MINISTRY OF EDUCATION SECONDARY 1 POSTING EXERCISE

All Primary 6 students who pass the PSLE – except those who have been allocated a place via the Direct School Admissions-Secondary (DSA-Sec) Exercise – are eligible to take part in the Secondary 1 Posting Exercise.

There are different option codes for the O-Level Programme and the Integrated Programme. The option code is 3014 for the O-Level Programme, and 9151 for the Integrated Programme. A student may choose VS (IP) as a first choice and VS (O-Level Programme) as a second choice.

ADMISSION TO YEAR 3 INTEGRATED PROGRAMME

We invite outstanding Secondary 2 students studying in other schools to apply for admission to Year 3 of the Victoria-Cedar Alliance Integrated Programme. Successful students will spend two years in VS and their final two years in Victoria Junior College (VJC), leading to the GCE A-Level Examination.

Applicants should have excellent PSLE and academic results in Secondary 1 and Secondary 2, outstanding academic achievements (e.g. at international and/or national competitions), strong leadership skills, and active participation in CCAs.

Application opens in October. Shortlisted applicants are required to participate in a panel interview in November.

OTHER ADMISSIONS EXERCISES

SCHOOL PLACEMENT EXERCISE FOR RETURNING SINGAPOREANS – SECONDARY (SPERS-SEC)

Singaporean students (Singapore citizens and Singapore Permanent residents) returning from overseas or currently studying abroad are advised to contact the Ministry of Education directly to participate in the School Placement Exercise for Returning Singaporeans – Secondary (SPERS-Sec).

SPERS-Sec is a centralised posting exercise conducted at around September or October each year for Returning Singaporeans who wish to join secondary schools at Secondary 1, Secondary 2 and Secondary 3 at the beginning of the next academic year.

INTERNATIONAL STUDENT ADMISSIONS

International students who wish to seek admission to mainstream schools are required to sit for and pass the Admissions Exercise for International Students (AEIS) administered by the Ministry of Education.

Admission to mainstream schools is subject to the applicant's performance in the centralised test and available school vacancies. Successful applicants will not be allowed to choose their school, and requests for school transfers will not be entertained.

Financial Information

FEES PAYABLE

The monthly fees for Victoria School are the same for students in the O-Level Programme and the Integrated Programme.

For 2024, they are as follows:

- Singapore citizen: \$28
- Permanent Resident: \$583
- IS (ASEAN): \$993
- IS (NON-ASEAN): \$1933

The fees payable include Miscellaneous Fees (\$20) and Autonomous School Fees (\$3).

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

VS is committed to ensuring that every student admitted into the school enjoys the benefits of the VS experience. Financial assistance is available to ensure that no deserving student is deprived of a high-quality education at VS.

MOE Financial Assistance

The Ministry of Education provides financial assistance to needy Singaporean students to pay for essential school expenses such as school fees, standard miscellaneous fees, textbooks and school attire.

The eligibility criteria for MOE financial assistance are:





- The family's Gross Household Income (GHI) does not exceed \$3000 per month; or
- The family's Per Capita Income (PCI) does not exceed \$750. PCI is computed based on GHI divided by the number of household members.

School-based Financial Assistance

VS students who are currently on the MOE FAS but require additional assistance (e.g. meal and/or transport subsidies), as well as those who are not eligible for MOE FAS but require assistance, may approach the school General Office for further information and assistance.
